Dear Mayor Scarpitti,

This year, Naturopathic Medicine Week (NMW) is April 28 to May 6, 2007. Hundreds of naturopathic doctors (NDs) across Canada will be opening their office doors or going into their communities to inform and educate people on the benefits of naturopathic medicine. Naturopathic Medicine Week 2007 establishes naturopathic medicine as a distinct system of primary care that addresses the root cause of illness or disease and promotes health and healing using natural therapies.

On behalf of the Canadian Association of Naturopathic Doctors and the Ontario Association of Naturopathic Doctors, I am writing to request that Mayor, Frank Scarpitti, proclaim April 28 to May 6, 2007 to be Naturopathic Medicine Week. This is an annual, national event occurring in municipalities across the country.

Naturopathic doctors are highly educated primary care providers who integrate standard medical diagnostics with a broad range of natural therapies. Treating a broad range of conditions ranging from common ailments such as cold and flu, food allergies, chronic fatigue, and childhood illnesses, to chronic degenerative conditions such as arthritis, asthma, heart, immune system, digestive and bowel conditions, naturopathic medicine is an integral part of Ontario's healthcare system. Naturopathic Medicine Week helps to raise the profile of this growing profession. This year's theme for NMW is "The Building Blocks of Health".

In Ontario, naturopathic doctors have been practicing for 82 years and today we have 1321 NDs practicing across Canada, about two-thirds of whom practice in Ontario.

On behalf of the tens of thousands of patients in Ontario who see an ND for their primary healthcare, and particularly the individuals in your community, I would very much appreciate you taking the time to proclaim this year's event.
