
Peace Parks across Canada has just begun, but will grow as a living legacy. On the U.N. International Day of Peace - the third Tuesday of September, every year - we encourage municipalities across Canada to dedicate an existing park as a "place of peace". On the same date, communities that already have a Peace Park, are invited to come together in celebration of Canada's commitment to world peace and environmental protection.

The International Institute for Peace through Tourism plans to extend the Peace Parks project internationally in 1993 reaching out to the global community in a growing expression of our universal desire for peace.

Dear Mayor Scarpitti:

May I extend a belated "Happy Canada Day" greeting to you.

Fifteen Years ago as Canada celebrated its 125<sup>th</sup> Birthday, some 400 cities and towns across Canada dedicated a Park to Peace – with most parks dedicated at Noon local time, October 8<sup>th</sup>, as the National Peacekeeping Monument was being unveiled in Ottawa.

"Peace Parks Across Canada" was the inspiration of – and organized by – the International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) in collaboration with "CANADA 125" and the National Capital Commission. Supporters included the Federation of Canadian Mayors and Municipalities, Heritage Canada, Canada Parks and Recreation Association, and the Tourism Industry Association of Canada.

We were most honored to have Markham as one of the 400 cities and towns joining us in this initiative, which was said to be the most successful and significant of the more than 25,000 events and projects conducted during "Canada 125."

As this is now the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of "Peace Parks Across Canada," and as Canada continues to be a beacon of Peace, Tolerance, and Understanding in a world of increasing violence and distrust, and a nation that celebrates diversity – we are seeking to reestablish communication with each of the 400 cities and towns that dedicated a Park to Peace in 1992 with a view to coordinating a nation-wide re-dedication at noon local time, Monday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2007 – the precise 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the original dedications. I am writing to request your assistance with this project.

The original Peace Parks each incorporated a 'Bosco Sacro' (Peace Grove) of 12 trees as a symbolic link with one another, and with nature - and as a symbol of hope for the future. The 12 trees were also symbolic of Canada's 10 Provinces and two Territories. As there are now three Territories, we are suggesting that a 13<sup>th</sup> tree be planted as part of the "Re-dedication Ceremony."

I am hopeful that Markham will join us in this commemorative re-dedication, and look forward to your kind response.

#### Dear Mayor Scarpitti:

This is a follow-up to my recent communication regarding "Peace Parks Across Canada" and the re-dedication of Peace Parks to commemorate the 15th anniversary of the project as part of "Canada 125" celebrations in 1992.

We have realized in the past few days that October 8th is Thanksgiving Day and accordingly are suggesting the re-dedication ceremonies be held on Tuesday, October 9th at noon local time, or alternatively, any other date that is more convenient.

As you may recall from my earlier letter and attachments, "Peace Parks Across Canada" was a project conceived and implemented by the International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) in collaboration with Canada 125 and the National Capital Commission (NCC).

As part of this initiative, 400 cities and towns across Canada dedicated a park to peace, as the National Peacekeeping Monument was being unveiled in Ottawa. Each park incorporated a 'Bosco Sacro' (Peace Grove) of 12 trees as a symbolic link with one another, and with nature - and as a symbol of hope for the future.

The 12 trees were also symbolic of Canada's 10 Provinces and two Territories. As there are now three Territories, we are suggesting that a 13th tree be planted as part of the "Re-dedication Ceremony"
