SUBJECT: 2009 Ontario Family Fishing Weekend







# Ontario Family Fishing Weekend July 10-12, 2009

If you, a friend or family member would like to try fishing in Ontario waters for the first time (or for the first time in a long time), circle the weekend of July 10-12, 2009 on your calendar. For those three days only (12:01 a.m. Friday to 11:59 p.m. Sunday), Canadian residents can enjoy the fun of fishing in Ontario without a license during the annual Ontario Family Fishing Weekend.

### All other regulations, fees and limits will apply

You must abide by the conservation license limits set out in the Fishing Ontario 2008-2009 Recreational Fishing Regulations Summary, available from fishing license issuers or the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources. For example, the limit on walleye and trout is two instead of five or six; some fish, such as pumpkinseed, have no limit; and of course, there is no limit to the number of fish you can release.

## Events related to this special weekend will take place across the province.
