#### E3 Revenue Enhancement Initiatives

#### **Overview**

- ➤ Today's presentation will provide an overview of the following E3 Revenue initiatives that were previously endorsed by the E3 Council Steering Committee and/or the Budget Sub-Committee:
  - 1. Library overdue fine increase from \$0.25/item/day to \$0.30/item/day
  - 2. Increase average parking fines from \$35/ticket to \$40/ticket
  - 3. Recreation user fee update
  - 4. Fitness initiation fees
  - 5. New tax account fee increase from \$50/account to \$60/account and expedited tax certificate fee of \$65
  - 6. Earlier tax installment dates
  - 7. Telecommunication facilities on Town owned property
  - 8. Update of the user fee by-law

# E3 Revenue Initiatives Library overdue fine increase from \$0.25/item/day to \$0.30/item/day

- ➤ On November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2008, the Budget Sub-Committee approved the initiative of increasing the Library overdue fines from \$0.25/item/day to \$0.30/item/day
- ➤ On December 15<sup>th</sup>, the Library Board passed a motion supporting the increase in fines to \$0.30 per item per day for books, magazines, talking books, music CDs, CD ROMs, children's kits, Express Bestsellers and Watt Readers
- > Staff anticipates that the \$0.30 overdue fine will be effective March 2nd, 2009
- ➤ The increase in overdue fines will provide additional revenues of \$30,000

# E3 Revenue Initiatives Increase average Parking Fine from \$35/ticket to \$40/ticket

- ➤ On November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2008, the Budget Sub-Committee approved the initiative of increasing the average parking fine from \$35/ticket to \$40/ticket
- ➤ The increase in parking fines is anticipated to be implemented by April 2009
- ➤ The increase in revenues in 2009 is projected to be approximately \$90,000 and the annualized impact will be approximately \$125,000 beginning in 2010

## E3 Revenue Initiatives Recreation User Fees Update

- ➤ This initiative is to increase the recreation user fees such that all fees for services within the Town rest within at least the 50<sup>th</sup> to 60<sup>th</sup> percentile of municipalities within the GTA
- ➤ Services that are currently higher than the 60th percentile will only be increased by the consumer price index for 2009
- Programs affecting children exclusively are not being considered at this time
- The fee increases to the above proposed programs will provide a projected increase of revenues by approximately \$89,000 in 2009

## **E3 Revenue Initiatives Fitness Initiation Fee**

- ➤ This initiative proposes to increase the adult resident and the adult non-resident one-time fitness initiation fees from \$62.50 to \$90 and from \$26.00 to \$120.00 respectively effective March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009
- > The increased fees are well within industry standards
- The fee increases will only apply to new members joining in 2009 and forward; therefore, all existing members are unaffected by this change
- > In addition, the fee increases will not apply to seniors and students
- This initiative will generate additional revenues of approximately \$25,500

### E3 Revenue Initiatives Increase Tax Related User Fees

- > Staff proposes to increase the administrative fee for new tax accounts from \$50/account to \$60/account
- This initiative will generate additional revenues of approximately \$24,000
- ➤ In addition, Staff recommends effective March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009, the implementation of an expedited tax certificate fee in the amount of \$65 which will provide additional revenues of approximately \$2,000

# E3 Revenue Initiatives Property Tax Installments

- ➤ E3 Council Committee endorsed that the due date for each of the three final tax installments be changed from the third week to the 5<sup>th</sup> day of each respective month effective for the final tax billing for the 2009 tax year
- ➤ Effective 2010, all 6 tax installments will be due on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of each respective month
- The move of the due date up by two weeks will improve cash flow and enhance investment income
- ➤ Based on current rates, an additional \$300,000 in investment revenues will be achieved in 2009 by changing the 3 final due dates
- For a full year with 6 installment dates change, the increased investment income is projected to be \$600,000
- ➤ Staff will ensure a plan to communicate this change to Markham residents occurs prior to the mailing of the final tax bills which will include a notice in the 2009 interim tax bills as well as on the Town's website and in the Town page of the Markham local newspapers

## E3 Revenue Initiatives Telecommunication Facilities on Town Owned Land

- Consumer demand for cellular phones, paging devices, and other wireless telecommunication services has increased significantly in recent years
- ➤ The Town receives inquiries from telecommunication providers to have these facilities located on Town owed lands mainly on parks or woodlots (3 inquiries to date in 2008)
- The Town will take advantage of this opportunity and it is expected that each facility can provide a revenue ranging from \$10K to \$15K annually. It is forecasted that between 4 to 8 facilities may be secured each year.
- ➤ This initiative is projected to provide revenues of \$70K in 2009

## E3 Revenue Initiatives User Fee By-Law

- ➤ This initiative is to increase the user fees & service charges and license fees within the user fee by-law and the licensing by-law by CPI on an annual basis
- ➤ Based on the CPI increase of 3.7% (Toronto All Items Sept 2007-2008), additional revenues of \$87,500 will be generated in 2009 (\$105,000 annualized)
- ➤ The additional revenues excluded CPI increase on the following areas as they have previously obtained Council authority to increase the user fees annually according to CPI:
  - Recreation
  - Fire Services
  - Museum, Arts Centre & Theatre
  - Development Services
  - Waterworks
- For other fee increases in aligning to match the market rates, Staff will bring forward separate reports to seek authorization from Council
