The Milne Pathway Working Group meeting convened at 7:11 PM with Councillor Carolina Moretti in the Chair.

## 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

There were brief round table introductions.

The Chair welcomed everyone and briefly explained the purpose of tonight's meeting.

### 2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION, PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

Alan Brown, Director of Engineering distributed a copy of the June 23, 2009 Council extract regarding the Milne Dam Conservation Area - Multi-Use Pathways and provided some background information.

Jay Cranstone, MMM Group delivered a PowerPoint presentation regarding the proposed multiuse pathway from Toogood Pond to Bob Hunter Park. It included the mulit-use pathway process and proposed recommendations pertaining to the Milne Dam Conservation Area. Jeff, MMM Group delivered a PowerPoint presentation regarding Ecological Land Classification (ELC) Communities and habitat areas.

The Working Group discussed and suggested the following:

- Advantages of using existing service access roads where possible within the Milne Dam Conservation Area
- Only consider "yellow" and "blue" options
- Remove "red" option
- On road route versus a route remaining within the park
- Will the entrances from Drakefield and Willowgate remain if the blue option is used
- Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) prefer the yellow option
- If go with the blue option then the entire area to the north can be regenerated
- Path width would need to be narrower (less than 2 metres in width)
- With yellow option how do you maintain the pathway that is accessible and at the same time regenerate the area
- Ensure the habitat areas within the park are protected
- Importance of defining the edges the of the pathway
- Accessibility issues need to outline where the pathway is accessible and where it is not
- Ensure TRCA comments are included for both the yellow and blue options when presenting to the public and Committee
- More discussion is needed regarding parking issues

The Working Group suggested that another meeting be scheduled to deal with Section G.
